2025 Jubilee Dedicated to Digital Missionaries and Catholic influencers, Plus Many More Special Jubilee Events

A special 'Jubilee of Digital Missionaries and Catholic Influencers' will be one of the jubilee events scheduled for next year in Rome. At the World Youth Day in Lisbon in 2023, influencers from all over the world gathered. As a result of that huge global impact, the Vatican, through Monsignor Lucio Adrian Ruiz, Secretary of the Dicastery for Communication, announced on 4/20/2024 that July 28-29, 2025 the Catholic influencers of the world should come and meet in Rome for a special Jubilee dedicated to them.

Everyone involved in evangelization through social media are invited to the *Jubilee of Digital Missionaries*, which will be held in the days immediately preceding the Jubilee of Youth. In a homily given by Cardinal José Tolentino de Mendonça, the Prefect of the Dicastery for Culture and Education, at a Mass for Catholic influencers, during World Youth Day in Lisbon, he told them: "Today the Church needs you, dear digital influencers, to be bearers of hope in those new spaces of social relationship made up of social media and social networks."

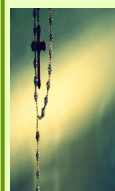
The Jubilee website goes on to say the 2025 Jubilee intends to promote a sense of community and communion among and with the digital missionaries. Pope Francis, addressing a group of digital missionaries, encouraged them to feel that sense of community, describing them as "part of the missionary life of the Church, which has never been afraid to embrace new horizons and new frontiers," and asking them "with creativity and courage, to announce God's Mercy." Activities celebrate segments of society such as February 8-9 for the Jubilee of Armed Forces, Police and Security Personnel, April 25-27 the Jubilee of Teenagers, April 28-29 the Jubilee of People with Disabilities, May 12-14 the Jubilee of the Eastern Churches, the Jubilee of Families, Children, Grandparents and the Elderly is set for May 30-June 1, while July 28 - August 3 will celebrate the Jubilee of Youth. Many others are noted on the calendar. The calendar area of the website also provides the location where the specific Jubilee will be celebrated.

MONTHLY DEDICATION - AUGUST

Each month of the year is dedicated to a specific Catholic devotion based on historical events or the liturgical calendar.

In August: The Month of the Immaculate Heart

The month of August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The physical heart of Mary is venerated (in comparison to the adoration of the Sacred Heart of Jesus) because it is united to her person and is the seat of her love (especially for her divine Son), virtue, and inner life. Such devotion is an incentive to a similar love and virtue.

The entire month of August falls within the liturgical season of **Ordinary Time**, which is represented by the liturgical color **green**. This symbol of hope is the color of the sprouting seed and inspires in the faithful the hope of reaping the eternal harvest of heaven, especially the hope of a glorious resurrection. It is used in the offices and Masses of Ordinary Time.

FEASTS/MEMORIALS/SOLEMNITIES THIS WEEK (Adapted from My Catholic Life)

Memorial of Saint John Eudes, Priest (8/19) 1601–1680
Patron Saint of Eudists, Order of Our Lady of Charity; Diocese of Baie-Comeau; and Missionaries. Canonized by Pope Pius XI on May 31, 1925. John Eudes' devout Catholic parents made a pilgrimage to the Church of Notre-Dame de la Recouvrance, 120 miles from Ri, to dedicate their son to God. After his Confirmation at age twelve, John made a personal vow of chastity, dedicating his life to God. After completing his philosophical studies, John persuaded his father to allow him to return to theological studies. When finished, John joined the French Oratory of Pierre de Bérulle in Paris and was ordained a priest at age twenty-four. In 1633, Father Eudes began preaching. His parish missions would sometimes last for weeks or even longer. His sermons emphasized God's mercy, and a large number of priests heard confessions. After ten years, he noticed that people quickly fell back into their sins after a mission. He turned his attention to clergy formation. In 1643, he left the Oratory and founded the Society of Jesus and Mary, later known as the *Eudists*, to provide for the formation of seminarians and parish missions. Over the next thirty years, he founded six major French seminaries at Caen, Coutances, Lisieux, Rouen, Evreux, and Rennes. These seminaries also welcomed priests for further education, formation, and retreats, while offering teachings to the laity. His most enduring legacies are his promotion of devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Holy Heart of Mary. In 1648, with the permission of the local bishop, he instituted a feast in honor of the Holy Heart of Mary, and reinforced the love that the Blessed Mother had for her Son and for all people. He also composed a Mass and Office in honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which he celebrated with the bishop's permission for the first time in 1670. His goal was to reveal the infinite and personal love of Christ Jesus for His people.

Memorial of Saint Bernard, Abbot and Doctor of the Church (8/20) 1090–1153, Patron Saint of beekeepers, bees, candlemakers, chandlers, Cistercians, and Knights Templar. Canonized by Pope Alexander III on January 18, 1174. Declared a Doctor of the Church (*Doctor Mellifluus*, "Honey-Sweet Doctor") by Pope Pius VIII in 1830. Bernard's mother's death when he was nineteen sparked his resolve to live solely for God. He decided to enter the newly formed Cistercian monastery in Cîteaux, the Abbey of Notre Dame. His virtue, clarity of purpose, and evident holiness then inspired thirty young noblemen to join him, including all of his brothers except the youngest, who would join him later, as would his father. His sister would become a Benedictine nun. In 1113, Bernard, his brothers, and their noble companions journeyed to the Abbey of Notre Dame where Abbot Stephen Harding joyfully admitted them. Abbot Stephen, now a saint, spent twenty-five years as abbot. Committed to a more faithful living of the Rule of Benedict, his holiness and administrative skills enabled the new Cistercian order to grow rapidly. Abbot Bernard earned respect for his holiness and leadership in monastic reform. A prolific writer, he left behind roughly 530 letters and 300 sermons, including a series of eighty-six sermons on the Song of Songs. Additionally, he wrote more than twenty longer works. Many miracles were attributed to him, including healing the sick, casting out demons, multiplying food, calming storms, and raising the dead. With spiritual discernment, he was able to read people's inner thoughts and intentions.

Memorial of Saint Pius X, Pope (8/21) 1835–1914,
Patron Saint of First Communicants and pilgrims. Canonized by Pope Pius XII on May 29, 1954. He was ordained a priest on September 18, 1858 at age twenty-three. After ordination, Father Sarto served for eight years as an assistant priest at the parish in Tombolo, often fulfilling the elderly pastor's duties. Impressed with his assistant's zeal and good sense, the pastor predicted Father Sarto would become a bishop and "after that—who knows?" At age forty, Father Sarto was elevated to Canon of the Cathedral at Treviso, Chancellor, and Vicar General. In 1884, Pope Leo XIII named Canon Sarto as Bishop of Mantua. In 1893, Pope Leo XIII appointed Bishop Sarto as Patriarch of Venice, naming him a cardinal. The Patriarch brought the same priorities to Venice. In 1903, the sixty-eight-year-old Bishop Sarto was elected Pope Leo XIII's successor. Pope Pius X's motto was "To restore all things in Christ" ([Ephesians 1:10](#)). A pastor at heart, he was humble, loved teaching children, and cared for the poor. He introduced a universal catechism, reformed the curia, renewed seminary formation, revised the Code of Canon, revitalized the liturgy, encouraged Gregorian Chant, and emphasized Saint Thomas Aquinas' teachings. His love for children led him to lower the age for First Holy Communion from twelve to seven, encouraging children

and adults to receive the Eucharist frequently. His death came just weeks after the start of World War I.

Memorial of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary (8/22) The twentieth century saw a resurgence in devotion to the Mother of God. On 12/8/1854, Pope Pius IX declared the Dogma of the Immaculate Conception. This was confirmed in 1858, when the Blessed Mother appeared in Lourdes to Bernadette Soubirous. The Heavenly Lady told Bernadette, "I am the Immaculate Conception." Lourdes became a frequent pilgrim site where many miracles have occurred. In 1916, three shepherd children in Fátima, Portugal received three apparitions from the Angel of Peace, the Guardian Angel of Portugal. In 1917, they received six apparitions from the Lady of the Rosary. At her final apparition, 70,000 witnessed the promised miracle. A pouring rain suddenly stopped, the sun danced and plunged to earth, and everything and everyone were immediately dry. In 1950, Pope Pius XII issued an apostolic constitution, declaring as dogma that Mary was assumed body and soul into heaven. On 10/11/1954, four years after proclaiming the Assumption, Pope Pius XII instituted the Memorial of the Queenship of Mary in his encyclical, *Ad Caeli Reginam* (*The Queen of Heaven*). This memorial was assigned to May 31st, following the Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. In 1969, Pope Paul VI moved the date to August 22nd, eight days after the Solemnity of the Assumption. This was done to create an octave of anticipation and to reinforce that the Assumption results in the Mother of God being also the Queen Mother of Heaven and Earth.

Memorial Saint Rose of Lima, Virgin (8/23) Patron Saint of the Americas, Peru, embroiderers, florists, gardeners, and people ridiculed for their piety. Invoked against vanity and self-love. Canonized by Pope Clement X in 1671. When she turned twenty, she followed in Saint Catherine of Siena's footsteps, becoming a lay member of the Third Order of Saint Dominic. Her life was of continuous prayer and penance, sleeping only two hours a night. Her self-made bed consisted of broken glass, stone, potsherds, and thorns. Roses concealed the metal spikes on the crown of thorns that she wore continuously, and she wore a chain of spikes around her waist. Her fasts were extreme, her penances doubled, but Rose could not have been happier. Rose died at age thirty-one and quickly acknowledged as a saint. About fifty years after, she was canonized as the first saint from the Americas. Miraculous healings had been attributed to her intercession while she was alive, and they continued after her death.

Feast of Saint Bartholomew, Apostle (8/24) First Century Patron Saint of bookbinders, butchers, cobblers, and trappers. Invoked against neurological diseases. Today, the Church honors one of the Twelve Apostles whom Jesus handpicked to form His Church and to go forth to the ends of the earth to share the Good News. Bartholomew, as he is named in the Synoptic Gospels, is most likely not his name, but a description of his lineage. His name in Aramaic is *bar-Tólmay*, translated as "son of Tolmai." Most scholars agree that the Bartholomew mentioned in the Synoptics is the same person as Nathanael in John's Gospel. When Nathanael came to Jesus, Jesus said to him, "Here is a true Israelite. There is no duplicity in him."
