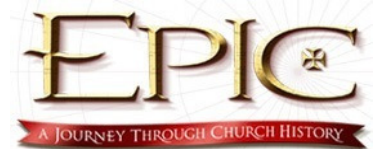

CARROLL SCHOOL **UPDATED** TUITION SCHOLARSHIP INFO

The technical issues that prevented earlier applications for the Invest in Kids scholarships at the Empower Illinois website have been resolved. Information is provided below about the updated application process. Carroll School families who are seeking tuition assistance are expected to first apply for a scholarship through Empower Illinois. Please let me know if you have any questions regarding the application process detailed below.

Empower Illinois Scholarship Application Opens this Tuesday, February 27 at 7 pm

The Empower Illinois scholarship application system will open on Tuesday, February 27 at 7 pm. The system has been enhanced to make it easier for families and to manage the demand expected for tax credit scholarships to private schools throughout Illinois.

The new application will be available through the Empower Illinois website. It will be a two-step process.

1. **Reserve:** On February 27 at 7 pm, families will complete a brief online form containing name and contact information, child name and preferred school. ***This will time stamp your application for the first-come, first-served scholarships.***
2. **Apply:** After reserving your place in line, families will be emailed a unique link and use their reservation code to complete the application. ***Applications will be sent on a rolling basis, over the course of a few weeks.*** After receiving the application email, families will have 3 days to complete the application and submit all required documents.

Our goal with this two-step process is to make it easier for families and provide more time to ensure your application is accurate and complete.

The reservation system will be accessible from mobile devices as well. Everything you will need for the reservation step should be top of mind. Once you get your application link, please use a computer to submit the required documents and finish the application accurately, without rushing.

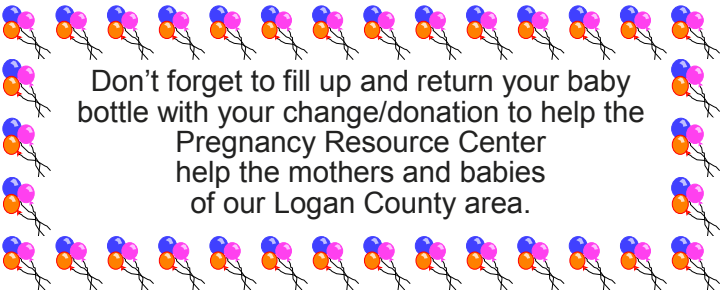

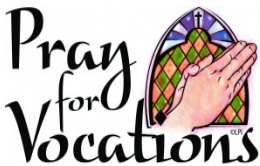

† We can profess to know Jesus but then act like He is merely an acquaintance. Through our baptism, we stand with the entire communion of saints who can testify to the power of Jesus. Yet, our baptism can at times seem like an event many years ago without any real bearing on our lives today. This Lent, make no mistake: Jesus is alive and well and standing in unity with all the saints. We have the baptismal call to testify to that reality. As we enter into these Lenten mysteries—although we may not fully understand the power of our God—we must be mindful that He is our Lord yesterday, today and forever.

<What does my baptismal call really mean to me?

† During Lent, we are called to repent and turn back toward God. That is only made possible by the mercy that our Father has for each of us. No one is too far away from God to return. No one has sinned to the point where God pulls back His mercy. We are all sinners before God, but by His grace, we can all be saved. Take God up on His offer of mercy. Return to Him and rest in His love.

<When was the last time I received the Sacrament of Penance?

† Jesus gave His very life for us. He suffered ridicule, was beaten, and then led to Golgotha to be crucified. Those events were a long time ago, but during Lent, we focus on His sacrifice and what it means for the world. We must never reserve those events to history lessons and religion classes. We must enter into the story and reflect on these greatest actions of love for all of us.

<Have I considered attending Stations of the Cross in my parish this season?

† Throughout our lives, we can find ourselves either closer to or further from God depending on our circumstances. Sometimes we are the prodigal; sometimes we are the faithful one. Either way, God loves us and longs for us to be even closer to Him. We will never find ourselves in a flawless relationship with God until we are with Him in heaven for eternity. Until then, we will continue the cycle of turning away and then returning to Him. He will continue to run towards us each and every time.
