

# MAY CROWNING 2017

The entire month of May is dedicated to Mary. Devotions include May Crownings that date back to the 16th century. Pope Pius VII originally sanctioned this tradition. May Crownings include prayers, a procession, singing Marian Hymns, and placing spring flowers on a statue of Our Lady. Even though the traditions of May Crownings go back centuries, many modern Catholics see spring flowers as reminders of our Lady. Violets are symbols of Mary's humility, lilies symbolize her purity, and roses symbolize her beauty. In fact, the rose is considered the gueen of flowers.

It is no surprise that Mary is sometimes identified as the

Mystical Rose or the Queen of the Universe.

#### All are invited to both services.

For Catholics, our devotion to Mary is just a part of us and our faith. Mary is a true model for us in the way that she lived her life and accepted God's invitation to become the Mother of His Son, Jesus.

Mary's name in Hebrew is *Miriam*. Mary's people were from Israel, so she was of the Jewish faith believing in one living God, told down through the generations from the time of Abraham and Sarah. She was devout in her faith following the Torah, observing the Sabbath and festivals, reciting prayers, lighting candles, and going to synagogue according to the custom in Galilee.

A most important Jewish prayer that Mary would probably have recited is called the *Shema*: "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God is one Lord; and you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might" (Deuteronomy 6:4-5).



#### FROM OUR PARISH NURSE

Southern Illinois University Center for Family Medicine began operation of its family medical clinic at the Logan County Department of Public Health, 109 3rd Street, Lincoln, on April 3. The SIU clinic offers a variety of services to include women's health, newborns and children, school and sports physicals, adolescent care and adult and geriatric medicine. SIU accepts Medicaid, Medicare and provides access to care regardless of insurance status or ability to pay. "Having primary medical care, public health and dental services all under one roof will help further assure the community has easy access to a full range of treatment and prevention services," stated Don Cavi, Public Health Administrator.
