Institution to Acolyte for Our Permanent Deacon Candidate

As you know, we are blessed to have a candidate for the Permanent Diaconate. Wendell Lowry and his wife, Brenda, have been attending formation weekends once a month, ten months a year for four years now.

The next formal step on the road to Ordination as Permanent Deacon will take place on **Saturday, August 20** at the 9:30 am Mass in the Cathedral of St. Mary of the Immaculate Conception, Peoria. On that day, Bishop Jenky will institute Wendell and his classmates in the Ministry of Acolyte.

An Acolyte is appointed to attend to the service of the altar. Thus, he assists the Deacon and the Priest at liturgical celebrations, distributes Holy Communion and instructs others who are to assist at liturgical celebrations.

The commitment that Wendell and Brenda have made to pursue this training and to prepare to serve all the people of our parishes is significant. We look forward to the day when Wendell shares the graces of the Sacrament of Holy Orders, and when both Wendell and Brenda know in even deeper ways, the joys of following Christ's call in their lives. Each parish is to implement the Emergency Operation Guidelines training as best fits the needs and situation of that parish. This will encompass dealing with any natural or man-made disasters that could occur when people are gathered at any of the Logan County Catholic Community facilities.

Census response has been good; please be sure to get these returned through the mail or in the Sunday offering basket!

The council would also like to see another parishwide Fall Potluck Get-Together at the K of C Hall, hopefully improving on the numbers from last year – let's make this a fun, annual event! There was much positive response from those who attended last year. A date and more information on this will follow soon.

Also, continue to watch for more details on the November 12 Leadership Encounter.

The council would like to add a youth member from age 14–21, and also discussed the three year term for all members as stated in the bylaws. So, please be thinking about becoming a parish council member as the terms of some members come to an end!

Various property managements are occurring: St. Mary's – new pews, St. Pat's – getting bids to renovate the basement, St. Thomas – Restroom renovation, and Holy Family – windows being redone in Jacksonville, and future tuck pointing and strengthening of roof trusses and floor joints, addition of restroom and handicap accessibility. If anyone is interested, touring the work being done on the stained glass windows in Jacksonville is very interesting, and the next tour is set for August 11.

This organization has begun a "Coupons for Overseas Military Program" that benefits the soldiers, and their families, stationed overseas. The program accepts coupons for both food and non-food products, as long as they are manufacturer's coupons - not store coupons. Participating bases and commissaries will even accept expired coupons as old as six months. Several bases have written the organization letting them know how much the effort is appreciated. A few types of coupons that are also appreciated are coupons for products and food for babies and dogs. The volunteers for Dove Inc. also feel that this program lets the soldiers know that they have not been forgotten by civilians back home. And after six days Jesus took with him Peter and James and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain apart. ² And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his garments became white as light. ³ And behold, there appeared to them Moses and Eli'jah, talking with him. ⁴ And Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is well that we are here; if you wish, I will make three booths here, one for you and one for Moses and one for Eli'jah."^{[4] 5} He was still speaking, when lo, a bright cloud overshadowed them, and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my beloved Son,^[b] with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." ⁶ When the disciples heard this, they fell on their faces, and were filled with awe. ⁷ But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Rise, and have no fear." ⁸ And when they lifted up their eyes, they saw no one but Jesus only. ⁹ And as they were coming down the mountain, Jesus commanded them, "Tell no one the vision, until the Son of man is raised from the dead."¹⁰ And the disciples asked him, "Then why do the scribes say that first Eli'jah must come?" ¹¹ He replied, "Eli'jah does come, and he is to restore all things; ¹² but I tell you that Eli'jah has already come, and they did not know him, but did to him whatever they pleased. So also the Son of man will suffer at their hands." ¹³ Then the disciples understood that he was speaking to them of John the Baptist.
