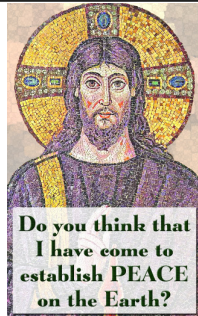

PRAY THE ROSARY!!

First of all, most weeks I place in the bulletin the block above trying to get more people to pray the Rosary. However, I need to take my own advice and do it. I have prayed the Rosary before, but certainly not on a daily basis.

In searching for information about the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary I came across an article written by renowned speaker, Meg Hunter-Kilmer. Meg states she is a Catholic "... madly in love with the Lord, His Word, His Bride the Church, and especially His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity in the Eucharist". She has two degrees in theology and five years in the classroom. Meg quit her job and has been a "hobo for Christ" since May 2012. She lives out of her car and travels the country speaking, giving retreats and blogging.

To make a long story short, in this particular article Meg states that she went to confession at one of the conferences where she was a featured speaker. Meg states that as her penance the priest gave her the Rosary to pray. Meg was stunned telling the priest that she already prays the Rosary every day. The priest told her she should be praying three Rosaries per day. Meg thought, "Ain't nobody got time for that! ... I can't pray more Rosaries. I barely have time for what I'm doing already. I'd have to cut out mental prayer or spiritual reading and I know that's a terrible idea." Meg then confessed that she doesn't like praying the Rosary. As I read that I thought, whoa!!!! I feel that way, but I would never say it, let alone confess it to millions of people. Meg says she has read books about the Rosary, taught others to pray the Rosary and given talks on the merits of the Rosary, but just doesn't like praying it.

Meg goes on to state that many people have many different preferences as to what kinds and types of prayers, meditations, etc., they prefer. Not everyone is going to love the Rosary and some will always struggle with the Rosary.

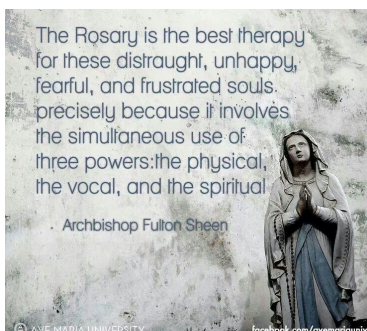
However, Meg states that she is not going to give up because she feels convinced that God is calling her to pray the Rosary and we all should be praying the Rosary ... everyday.

Meg gives six reasons why:

1. It is objectively a good way to pray.
2. You need your Mother.
3. You're in good company.
4. It consecrates a busy day.
5. Sometimes mindless prayer is the best you can do.
6. It's something to cling to in a crisis.

In closing, Meg says she will pray the Rosary not because of what it does for her, but because of what it does to her, even when she doesn't notice it.

BOUNDLESS GRACES SHOWERED UPON THOSE WHO DILIGENTLY PRAY THE ROSARY

The Blessed Virgin Mary promised to Saint Dominic and to all who follow that "Whatever you ask in the Rosary will be granted." She left for all Christians Fifteen Promises to those who recite the Holy Rosary:

1. Whoever shall faithfully serve me by the recitation of the Rosary, shall **receive signal graces**.
2. I promise my **special protection** and the **greatest graces** to all those who shall recite the Rosary.
3. The Rosary shall be a **powerful armor against hell**, it will **destroy vice, decrease sin**, and **defeat heresies**.
4. The Rosary will **cause virtue** and good works to flourish; it will obtain for souls the **abundant mercy of God**; it will **withdraw the hearts of men from the love of the world and its vanities**, and will **lift them to the desire for eternal things**. Oh, that souls would sanctify themselves by this means.
5. The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation of the Rosary, **shall not perish**.
6. Whoever shall recite the Rosary devoutly, applying himself to the consideration of its sacred mysteries shall **never be conquered by misfortune**. God will not chastise him in His justice, he shall not perish by an unprovided death; if he be just **he shall remain in the grace of God**, and become **worthy of eternal life**.
7. Whoever shall have a true devotion for the Rosary **shall not die without the sacraments** of the Church.
8. Those who are faithful to recite the Rosary shall have **during their life and at their death the light of God** and the **plentitude of His graces**; at the moment of death they **shall participate in the merits of the saints** in paradise.
9. I shall **deliver from Purgatory** those **who have been devoted to the Rosary**.
10. The faithful children of the Rosary shall **merit a high degree of glory in Heaven**.
11. You shall **obtain all you ask** of me **by the recitation of the Rosary**.
12. All those who **propagate the Holy Rosary** shall be **aided by me in their necessities**.
13. I have obtained from my Divine Son that all the **advocates of the Rosary shall have for intercessors the entire celestial court during their life and at the hour of death**.
14. All **who recite the Rosary** are my sons and daughters, and brothers and sisters of my only Son Jesus Christ.
15. Devotion of my Rosary is a **great sign of predestination**
