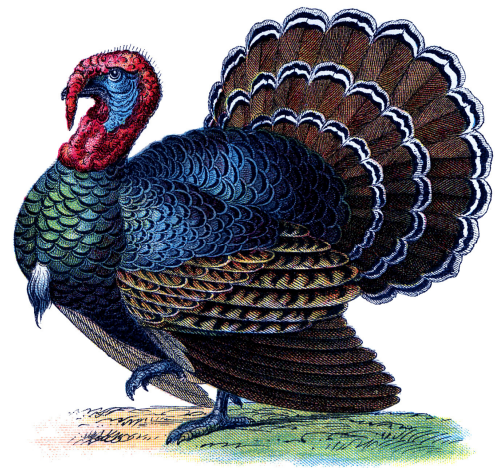

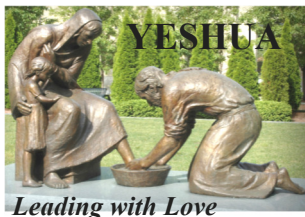

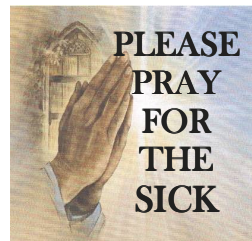
"Feed the Hungry . . ."

Respect Life Month!

Pray that we will respect all human life (from the moment of conception to the moment of natural death) as a gift from God; for an end to abortion (every fourth baby dies from abortion); that we affirm the individuality of each person through fairness, dignity and compassion; for an end to the death penalty. "The measure of love is to love without measure."

Celebrated as Respect Life Month, October also shares the observance of Domestic Violence Awareness Month

In his recent Respect Life Month statement Cardinal Dolan reflected, "God loves us, treats us with respect, and asks us to do the same with others. ...No one should ever be treated callously or carelessly—everyone should be cherished and protected!"

"Violence against another person in any form fails to treat that person as someone worthy of love."

Let's pray this month for all who are not treated according to their God-given dignity, especially those suffering abuse.

Bishop Malone refers to Pope Francis's commentary on "throwaway culture," wherein people are treated as disposable. Other than domestic violence, where do you see examples of a "throwaway culture," and how you can counteract it?
