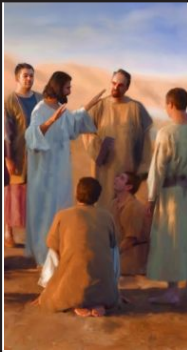
REQUEST FOR ASSISTANCE

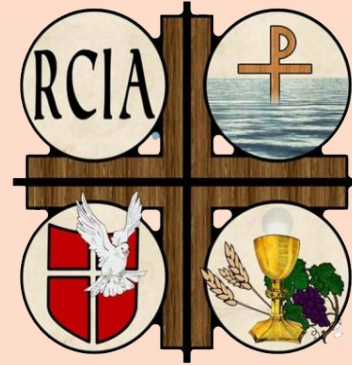
2023 Annual Diocesan Appeal

Saint Memorials This Week
(Adapted from *My Catholic Life!*)

Memorial of Saints Cosmas and Damian, Martyrs - Today (9/26), the Church honors Saints Cosmas and Damian - twin brothers, physicians, and martyrs widely venerated in the East and West since the time of their deaths. Though we know little about these saints, we do know they were martyrs probably murdered under Roman Emperor Diocletian orders. Because Cosmas and Damian were Christians, legend holds that they decided to evangelize the largely pagan community in which they lived by doing something extraordinary. They offered their physician healing services for free! This caught the attention of their fellow citizens and drew many to the faith. After the persecution edicts were announced they were arrested. They refused to denounce Christ and were sentenced to death. Legends state that they were first tortured, however, they were miraculously preserved from suffering, sustaining no injuries. Multiple attempts were then made to kill them by drowning, fire, arrows, and stoning, but each failed. Finally, they, along with three of their brothers, were beheaded. Many miraculous healings have been attributed to their intercession. Their work of evangelization through free and selfless service in the name of Christ is worthy of imitation.

Memorial of Saint Vincent de Paul, Priest (9/27) - Patron Saint of charitable societies and workers, hospitals and hospital workers, lepers, lost articles, prisoners, spiritual help, and volunteers. Canonized by Pope Clement XII on June 16, 1737. Born to peasant farmers, his father sold an ox so that he could send his son to be formally educated. Vincent was sent to the seminary in Dax where he lived with the Franciscan Friars. A few years later, he was sent to the University of Toulouse to study theology and was ordained a priest at the age of nineteen or twenty. After receiving an inheritance, he took a boat north and was captured by pirates. They sold him as a slave. It was his third owner, a Franciscan priest who had become Muslim who helped him get back to his community. In fact, Fr. Vincent converted him back to Christianity. The imprisonment moved him to care for the poor and suffering. He founded the Daughters of Charity, Confraternities of Charity, and the Congregation of the Mission, all thriving at his death. He was the inspiration for Frédéric Ozanam's founding what is now known as the Saint Vincent de Paul Society, an international lay organization providing direct relief and compassion to the poor at local levels.

Memorial of Saint Wenceslaus, Martyr and Saint Lawrence Ruiz, and Companions, Martyrs (9/28) - Wenceslaus was born in Bohemia, present-day western Czech Republic, during a transitional period. His mother was anti-Catholic and ultimately had her very devout son's grandmother killed and her son—at the hands of his younger brother! Wenceslaus' last words are recorded as, "May God forgive you, brother." Shortly after, Wenceslaus was venerated as a martyr and saint. Though Wenceslaus died as a duke, Holy Roman Emperor Otto I posthumously crowned him king, earning him the title "Good King Wenceslaus." The other saints we honor today are Saint Lawrence and companions. They were part of a huge group targeted, tortured, and assassinated by Japanese shoguns' campaigns against Christians from 1597-1639. Thousands were killed and many were canonized or beatified.

Feast of Saints Michael (Who is like God), Gabriel (God is my Strength), and Raphael (God has healed), Archangels (9/29) - Patron Saints of soldiers, police, paramedics, and the sick and dying (Michael); messengers, postal workers, broadcasters, and expectant mothers (Gabriel); travelers, the blind, medical workers, and matchmakers (Raphael). There are nine choirs in the hierarchy of angels, further divided into three triads. The third triad (Principalities, Archangels, and Angels) is closest to humanity, acting as mediators between God and man. We honor the Archangels today.

Memorial of Saint Jerome, Priest and Doctor of the Church - Patron Saint of archeologists, archivists, Bible scholars, librarians, libraries, schoolchildren, students, and translators. Declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Benedict XIV in 1724. He spent his life translating the Old and New Testament from Greek and Hebrew to Latin; declared the official Latin translation of the Church in 1546 by the Council of Trent.
