Saint Memorials This Week
(Adapted from My Catholic Life!)

Memorials of St. Denis, Bishop & Companions St. Eleutherius and St. Rusticus Martyrs (10/9) - St.

Denis was a 3rd century bishop of Paris who was martyred on the highest hill in Paris (Montmartre—mount of the martyrs) during the persecutions under by Decius. His companions were St. Eleutherius, the deacon, and St. Rusticus, the presbyter. Devotion to the three led St. Genevieve to begin the construction of a basilica in their honor on the hill where they were killed. Considered patrons saints of Paris and of France.

Memorial of Saint John Leonardi, Priest (10/9) - St.

Leonardi founded the Congregation of Clerics Regular of the Mother of God in 1574. They number only 120, today. He published a compendium of Christian doctrine in 1579 that was used through the 19th century. He also co-founded with Saint Phillip Neri at Rome the Collegio Urbano which, under the direction of the Congregation of the Evangelization of Peoples, trains priests for foreign missions.

Memorial of Saint John XXIII, Pope (10/11) -

Today's Saint, born Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli, served in WWI as a stretcher-bearer. In 1923, he became a papal diplomat and served in Bulgaria, Turkey and France. With the help of Germany's ambassador to Turkey, St. John saved the lives of 24,000 Jews in WWII. Pope Pius XII named St. John a cardinal and patriarch of Venice in 1953. He was elected Pope 5 years later at age 78. He took the name John after his father and the two patron of Rome's cathedral, St. John Lateran. He was known for his modesty and pastoral concern. Good Pope John dedicated his ministry to placing the Church at the service of the needs of the world. He surprised the world by announcing the Second Vatican Council on 1/25/1959. It was his hope that the council would signal a new style for the Church and her authority. He died of stomach cancer on 6/3/1963. This feast day honors the day of the first session of the Second Vatican Council (held from 1962-1965). He was declared Blessed in 2000, canonized together with Pope John Paul II, by Pope Francis on 4/27/2014.

Memorial of St. Callistus I, Pope & Martyr (10/14)

Patron Saint of cemetery workers - Pope Callistus instituted the Ember Days of fast and abstinence as pope and is remembered as a martyr. The Ember days were days of fasting at the beginning of the four seasons as a way of asking God for blessings in each of those seasons. The saint was known as an advocate for mercy toward apostates (persons who renounced their beliefs) who desired to rejoin the Church. By God's grace, he had gone from slavery, to prisoner, to freeman, to deacon, to pope. He was a man of great compassion. He also organized the first official Christian cemetery in Rome. The Catacombs of Saint Callistus, as they are called today, were a massive multi-level underground cemetery used primarily for Christians from the second to fourth centuries. The tunnels span several miles and remain a popular place of pilgrimage. Estimates are that as many as a half million people are buried there. Burials included several early popes and beloved Roman martyrs, making the catacombs an important place of prayer. During the reign of Roman Emperor Alexander Severus, a persecution of Christians broke out in the empire, especially in Rome. A Roman priest named Calepodius was tortured and thrown into the Tiber River with a millstone tied around his neck. Pope Callistus found his body and buried it in a catacomb. Afterwards, one tradition notes that Calepodius appeared to the pope and prophesied the pope would soon be martyred. Shortly afterwards, Pope Callistus was arrested, starved for a week, tortured, and then thrown into a deep well with a stone around his neck. Pope Callistus' body was later recovered and buried next to Calepodius. In the ninth century, both of their bodies were transferred to the Basilica of Santa Maria in Trastevere founded in the 3rd century and commissioned by Pope Callistus, though built under Pope Julius I around 350 A.D.

Wednesday, October 11th, we will begin an 11-week series on the Book of Revelation.

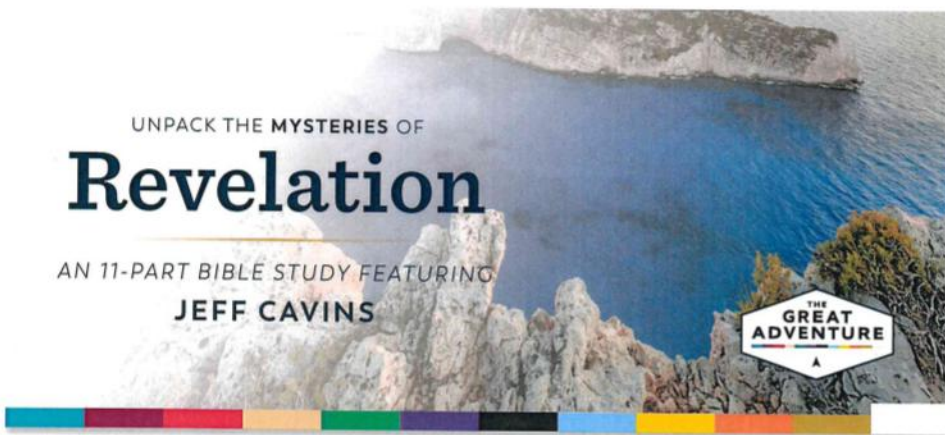
