The Catholic Schools Week (CSW) 2023 – 2026 theme is "Catholic Schools: United in Faith and Community." Catholic schools have an irreplaceable role in the Church's evangelizing mission. Building on the central goal of Catholic schools to form saints, Catholic schools teach and embrace the whole person, body, mind and spirit. The fact that all members of a Catholic school community share the Christian vision of faith that Christ is the foundation of Catholic education is what unites the school as a faith-filled community.

While faith is the binding element in Catholic schools, the Church reiterates that parents are the first teachers of their children. Holding this tenet, Catholic school communities expand beyond the walls of school buildings to envelop the family as an integral part of the school community. Together teachers, administrators, staff, students and parents fuel the light of faith by integrating culture with faith and faith with living.

The CSW logo symbolizes the united community of Catholic schools – not a building or an institution, but people of faith serving God and others. No Catholic school can fulfill its educational role alone. As a community, Catholic schools are nourished and stimulated by the centrality of the word of Christ expressed through knowledge, service, scripture and sacramental tradition. Now that the Christmas season is over, we begin preparing for the next step in the RCIA, which begins with the liturgical season of Lent. For the RCIA candidates and catechumens, Lent is a period of "Retreat", a final preparation before the celebration of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion). The Lenten season is a period of Purification and Enlightenment. The first step in this preparation period is the Rite of Election, which takes place at the Cathedral of St. Mary of the Immaculate Conception in Peoria on February 18th. After that rite, Chad Smith, our catechumen will become an Elect, one chosen by God and affirmed by the Church (the Logan County Catholic Community) to be initiated at the Easter Vigil. Please continue to support Chad and the RCIA team with your prayers.

WHAT IS THE PROCESS FOR THE HOLY FATHER'S MONTHLY GLOBAL PRAYER INTENTIONS

The Holy Father's monthly prayer intentions are entrusted to the Worldwide Prayer Network and serve as a global call to transform prayers into concrete actions. Originally established in 1844 as the Apostleship of Prayer, this network, initiated by the Jesuits, was modified under Pope Francis. In 2016, he renamed it The Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network, elevating it to pontifical work status in 2018. Later, in 2020, the network attained the status of a Vatican Foundation gaining both canonical and juridical recognition.

Each month, Pope Francis, through his Worldwide Prayer Network, shares prayer intentions that express his profound concerns for humanity and the mission of the Church. These monthly intentions are meant to act as a compass for a mission of compassion for the world, encouraging the faithful to combine prayer and action in building a more humane and caring world.

These prayer intentions result from an extensive discernment process within the Church, incorporating proposals from various official congregations of the Holy See, and services of the Holy See across different countries. After several months of discernment, the Pope, having received the proposals, takes dedicated time to pray and discern the challenges facing humanity and the mission of the Church. Afterwards, he entrusts these twelve prayer intentions to all the faithful, providing them with guidelines for life and mission.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK (Adapted from My Catholic Life!)

Memorial of Saint Vincent, Deacon & Martyr (1/2) - Late Third Century-c. 304, Patron Saint of vinegar makers, wine makers, brickmakers, and sailors. Pre-Congregation canonization. He was a martyr during Diocletian's reign of terror in the early 300's. Saint Vincent of Saragossa born in today's Spain carries the title of "protomartyr," as he was the first, or "proto," man to die for Christ on the Iberian Peninsula. Legends say his Bishop had a speech impediment and both were imprisoned. Vincent said to him he would speak (renounce their faith), if ordered. The bishop replied, "Son, as I committed you to dispense the word of God, so I now charge you to answer in vindication of the faith which we defend." That was all Vincent needed. At that moment, the words of Holy Scripture were fulfilled in Vincent, "When they hand you over, do not worry about how you are to speak or what you are to say. You will be given at that moment what you are to say. For it will not be you who speak but the Spirit of your Father speaking through you" (Matthew 10:19-20). He was persecuted and ultimately died.

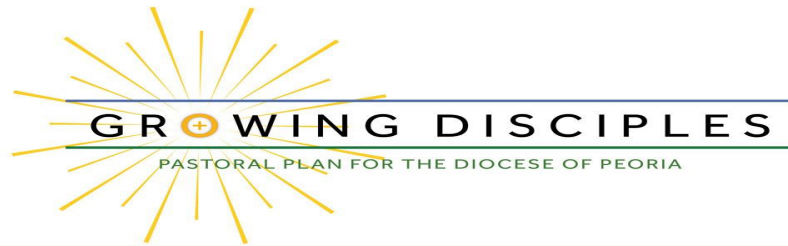
Memorial of Saint Marianne Cope, Virgin (1/23) - 1838-1918, Patron Saint of lepers, outcasts, those with HIV/AIDS, & Hawaii. Canonized 10/21/2012, by Pope Benedict XVI. Born in Germany, Barbara Koob was brought to the United States by her parents before the age of one. They settled in Utica, New York, and joined Saint Joseph Parish where Barbara later attended grade school. After grade school, she began working in a textile factory to support the family after her father became ill. Despite longing to enter religious life, Barbara continued to financially support her family for the next 9 years. In 1862, at 24, she entered religious life at the Sisters of Saint Francis in Syracuse, New York taking the name Marianne. For the next 21 years, she served as a teacher, principal, mother superior, provincial superior, hospital founder, and administrator. She was a trailblazer who specialized in caring for the outcasts of society with love. In 1883, Mother Marianne's life would change forever. She received a request from the government in Hawaii asking her to send sisters to care for those suffering from the dreaded disease of leprosy. With joy and enthusiasm that would have delighted Saint Francis, her order's founder, she responded "Yes!" "I am hungry for the work..." 50 others orders had declined. She spent 35 years working with the afflicted, helping them to live dignified lives. She even cared for Fr. Damien and his school for boys in Molokai. She died of natural causes at the age of eighty, never contracting the disease herself.

Memorial of Saint Francis de Sales, Bishop & Doctor of the Church (1/24) 1567-1622, Patron Saint of authors, journalists, writers, deaf persons, educators. Canonized 4/8/1665, by Pope Alexander VII. Declared a Doctor of the Church in 1877 by Pope Pius IX. In 1586, at the age of nineteen, Francis attended a Calvinist lecture on predestination, which led him to believe he was destined for hell. He struggled with the idea for months. Eventually, through the intercession of our Blessed Mother and the Memorare prayer, Francis was freed from this error and turned his focus to the pure love of God. Francis' sermons in the Diocese of Geneva (heavily Calvinistic) were preached with great respect for those who disagreed with him. He never shied away from the theological truths under attack by the errors of the Reformation. He avoided controversy and criticism, focusing instead on virtues, prayer, holiness, and overcoming sin. In 1602, at the age of thirty-five, Father de Sales was ordained Bishop of Geneva. He had success bringing people back to the faith by placing written explanations of the faith under people's doors and inviting them back to the Catholic Church. He believed that everyone, in every state in life, within every occupation, was called to a life of sanctity. He passed from stroke complications.

Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul, Apostle (1/25) c. 33-34 Patron Saint of missionaries, evangelists, writers, public workers, ropemakers, saddle makers, and tentmakers. Invoked against hailstorms and snakebites. His Hebrew name was Saul and he persecuted Christians. He was converted by Ananias who cured his blindness. He was converted, baptized and began a new life as an apostle of the Lord to the Gentiles. Saint Paul was arguably the greatest evangelist in the history of the Church, but needed the help of others to spread the word.

Memorial of Saints Timothy and St. Titus, Bishops—Saint Timothy: 17-97, Invoked against intestinal disorders and stomach diseases. Saint Titus: First Century-96, Patron Saint of Crete. Today the Church honors two of Paul's co-workers. Saints Timothy and Titus were both chosen as bishops in the apostolic age of the early Church, and each received letters from Saint Paul that are included in the New Testament. Timothy was a Jew, Titus was Greek. Timothy died a martyr's death by stoning at about the age of eighty, after opposing a procession in honor of the pagan goddess Diana. No details are known about the death of Titus.

Memorial of Saint Angela Merici, Virgin 1474-1540, Patron Saint of sickness, death of parents, disabled, handicapped/physically challenged people. Canonized 5/24/1807 by Pope Pius VII. Angela originally joined the Third Order Franciscans, the lay branch of the larger Franciscan Order. Ultimately, a new order was formed "Ursulines" and the "Company of Saint Ursula." God asked her to care for and teach young girls, which she did.



AN UPDATE ABOUT THE GROWING DISCIPLES INITIATIVE FROM BISHOP LOUIS TYLKA

Thank you to all our priests and Key Parish Leaders from across the Diocese of Peoria for hosting Growing Disciples parish meetings to explain the second set of draft models and how parishioners could provide feedback. Gathering information from those parish meetings is a critical element in the ability to move forward in this important pastoral planning process.

The Growing Disciples Core Team received over 2600 electronic and paper surveys. Bishop Tylka received several hundred personal letters from parishioners and community members, sharing their feelings about the process and what our possibilities could be as we look to the future. The feedback has come from all over the diocese and all parishes. Not everyone in every parish, or even every family, agreed on the steps we should take moving forward.

What is clear is that this process is awakening within all of us that desire for us to continue to be the Church and to grow the Church. We are passionate about our faith. We are passionate about our parishes. We are passionate about our mission that Jesus has given to us to share the Good News.

We also know we are living in very different times. The generations that preceded us had their own challenges and opportunities to live out our faith. Ours is a very different time and we must discern a way forward to build a more sustainable, mission driven, vibrant church for tomorrow.

In the coming months, our Growing Disciples Core Team, our Diocesan Commission and ultimately the Presbyteral Council will be discerning recommendations, based on the feedback, to be given to the Bishop, who will make the final decision.

Let us remain a people of prayer: praying for each other and supporting one another as we go through this process.
