The Core Team has reviewed the data and met to propose the final draft models. In the coming month the Diocesan Pastoral Planning Commission will review their work. It will then be submitted to the Presbyteral Council to make recommendations for the Bishop to consider in the final decisions. Bishop Tylka is most grateful for all the work that has brought us to this point and asks for your continued prayers during this time of discernment.

LENT WITH THE HALLOW APP

We have partnered with *Hallow* to encourage all parishioners to surrender and trust in the Lord in a new, deeper way throughout Lent. *Hallow* is a Catholic prayer and meditation app that helps us strengthen our relationship with God through a habit of daily prayer. This Lent, as a part of the *Hallow Pray40 Challenge*, we'll walk through the life-changing, spiritual classic *He Leadeth Me*, written by Fr. Walter J. Ciszek, S.J.

Fr. Walter, a Jesuit priest and missionary, was imprisoned for over twenty years in the Soviet Union, first in solitary confinement and then in a Siberian worker camp. Amidst some of the most brutal conditions imaginable, Fr. Walter underwent a profound spiritual journey. Inspired by Fr. Walter's writing, we'll spend time each day prayerfully seeking a refreshed humility and hope in Christ, who laid down His life for us, as we journey through Lent.

Hallow is the #1 Catholic app worldwide and includes 1,000 prayer sessions available for free, and over 10,000 audio-guided sessions in an upgraded premium subscription. *Hallow* is designed to help you grow closer to God and develop a daily habit of prayer, and includes prayers for kids and families, resources for mental health, meditations for sleep, seasonal music, multiple languages (including Spanish, Portuguese, and Polish!), daily trivia, podcast-style courses to learn about our faith, and more! SAINTS OF THE WEEK (Adapted from My Catholic Life!)

Ash Wednesday (2/14) - Lent begins today when we receive ashes reminding us that we are sorry for our sins. Today is one of 2 mandatory fasting days for Catholics. Many people around the world, and in our town, will have no choice in the matter. Nearly 10% of people globally are affected by hunger. As you fast today, keep people who struggle with hunger or food insecurity in your prayers. Consider making a trip to the grocery store on behalf of the food pantry or make the pantry the subject of your weekly almsgiving this Lent.

Memorial of the Seven Founders of the Order of Servites, Religious (2/17) - Invoked to aid in the imitation of the charity and patience of Our Lady of Sorrows. Canonized January 15, 1888 by Pope Leo XIII. Bonfilii, Alexis, Manettus, Amideus, Hugh, Sostene, and Buonagiunta were seven successful cloth merchants from Florence, Italy. As members of a lay organization dedicated to the Blessed Mother, they were each devout in their faith. Their comradery, centered around their faith, not only united them more fully to God, but also to each other with a holy bond and a holy mission.

Around the year 1233, all seven of these devout men individually experienced an apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary, calling them to withdraw from the world and to devote themselves entirely to the service of God. They obeyed, and on September 8, the Feast of the Birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary, they gave up their careers and property and moved into a dilapidated house outside the city wall. They embraced the mendicant life of begging, poverty, and prayer. Many were drawn to them and found in them men of wisdom and virtue. As a result, they received many requests for spiritual counsel and moral guidance. Around the year 1240, at Monte Senario, the seven received a joint vision of the Blessed Virgin Mary who appeared to them surrounded by angels. She instructed them on their mission, clothed them in their habits, presented them with their rule of life, and personally founded their order.

Central to their mission was to spread devotion to the Seven Sorrows of Mary and to be her servants. These men shared a vision of the Virgin Mary that inspired the founding of the Servite Order. Their holy friendship and dedication is a model for reaching sanctity through community.

REGULATIONS FOR LENT AND THE EASTER TRIDUUM

Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year. Priests, religious and laity are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, attentiveness to prayer, and especially to works of charity and mercy.

† Everyone of 14 years of age or over is bound to *abstain from meat* on Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2024, and all the Fridays of Lent.

† Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2024 and Good Friday, March 29, 2024. On these two days of fast and abstinence, *Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed.* Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

† To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is a serious matter.
