Let's Explore Jubilee 2025

For the remainder of 2024, aspects of Pope Francis' Jubilee 2025 will be highlighted. This week marks 25 weeks to the opening of the Holy Doors at St. Peter's Basilica on December 24, 2024. This is usually the first door opened to signal the start of the Jubilee Year. A

Cathedral or popular Sanctuary of each diocese will also designate or open its Holy Door to allow the entry of pilgrims. The jubilee years also traditionally offer opportunities for reconciliation, indulgences, and other events intended to strengthen and revive faith. You can find a "Jubilee 2025 Information Sheet" at [Information for Jubilee 2025 | USCCB](#). It includes information about the overall celebration, its prayer, hymn and logo, in addition to details about coordinating pilgrimages to Rome and hosting activities in our parish, along with insights in the "frequently asked questions" section.


Today, we will focus on the Jubilee Logo. The logo has four figures who represent all of humanity, coming from the four corners of the earth. They embrace each other to indicate the solidarity and fraternity which should unite all peoples. The figure at the front is holding onto the cross. It is not only the sign of the faith which the front figure holds, but also the sign of hope, which can never be abandoned, because we are always in need of hope, especially in our moments of greatest need.

There are rough waves under the figures, symbolizing that life's pilgrimage does not always go smoothly in calm waters. Often daily life and events in the world require a greater call to hope. Focus on the lower part of the cross which has been elongated and turned into the shape of an anchor which is let down into the waves. An anchor is well known as a symbol of hope. In maritime jargon the 'anchor of hope' refers to the reserve anchor used by vessels involved in emergency maneuvers to stabilize a ship during storms.

The image shows a pilgrim's journey not as an individual undertaking, but rather as something communal leading one closer to the cross. The cross in the logo is dynamic, not static. It bends down towards humanity, not leaving human beings alone, but stretching out to them to offer the certainty of its presence and the security of hope. At the bottom of the logo is the motto of the 2025 Jubilee Year in green letters, *Peregrinantes in Spes* (Pilgrims in hope).

FEASTS/MEMORIALS/SOLEMNITIES THIS WEEK (Adapted from My Catholic Life)

Feast of St. Mary Magdalene (7/22) First Century Patron Saint of pharmacists, contemplatives, converts, glovemakers, hairdressers, penitent sinners, people ridiculed for their piety, perfumers, reformed prostitutes, tanners, women. Invoked against sexual temptations. Mary of Magdala, is most likely named after the bustling fishing village of Magdala on the western edge of the Sea of Galilee. All information about Mary comes from the Gospels. [Luke 8:1-3](#) introduces her as one of the many women who accompanied Jesus and the Twelve, providing for them out of their own resources. These women are said to have been "cured of evil spirits and infirmities," and Mary is specifically noted to have been delivered from "seven demons." Being delivered from seven demons carries significant implications. It could mean that Mary was genuinely possessed, obsessed, or oppressed by seven distinct demons. The number seven also symbolizes perfection, implying she may have been completely possessed or that her deliverance from these demons, and from a life of sin and evil, was a perfect deliverance. In other words, she never returned to the sins from which Jesus delivered her.

Memorial of Saint Bridget of Sweden, Religious (7/23) 1303-1373, Patron Saint of Europe, Sweden, and widows. Canonized by Pope Boniface IX on 10/7/1391. Her father was one of the wealthiest landowners in Sweden, and her mother came from a family of rulers, including kings of Sweden. Both were devout Catholics. When she was seven, she had a vision of the Blessed Virgin Mary who presented her with a crown. From that time on, Bridget's seriousness about her spiritual life deepened. As a young teenager, Bridget was given in marriage to a young man a few years older than her. They had 8 children. After her husband's death, Bridget devoted herself to a life of prayer and penance, and her visions of Jesus and Mary increased. These visions, often referred to as revelations, directed her life, instructed her to found a monastery, and revealed to her various mysteries and prophecies. Among her writings is a particular revelation and devotion that many continue to use today. Bridget prayed for a long time to learn from Jesus more about His Passion. She requested that Jesus reveal to her how many blows He suffered on His Body. Jesus told her "I received 5,480 blows upon My Body. If you wish to honor them in some way, recite fifteen Our Fathers and fifteen Hail Marys with the following prayers, which I Myself shall teach you, for an entire year. When the year is finished, you will have honored each of My Wounds." These prayers, which are commonly referred to as the "Fifteen Prayers of Saint Bridget," remain a popular daily devotion since the Middle Ages.

Memorial of St. Sharbel Makhluf, Priest (7/24) Though Saint Sharbel lived a life of extraordinary holiness, it wasn't until after his death that his holiness became well known beyond the walls of the monasteries. After his burial, light was seen shining forth from his grave. This phenomenon drew the attention of many villagers who braved the cold and snow to see this mysterious light. After four months, permission was granted by the Church authorities to exhume his body. To the wonderment of all, his body was found to be completely incorrupt. His skin and joints were like one who was sleeping, soft and flexible. He was cleaned of the dirt and mud from his gravesite and placed in a coffin in the monastery chapel. Then something else began to happen. Blood and sweat appeared to be coming forth from his pores, soaking his habit. In the 1950's, his tomb was opened three times. One of those times was broadcast on television and attended by high-ranking state officials, religious officials, medical doctors and scientists. In 1965 his body was found, once again, to be incorrupt and exuding the same blood and sweat. Finally, in 1976, the year before his canonization, his body was found to have finally decayed, only the bones remaining.

DIOCESAN 25TH & 50TH WEDDING ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

FEASTS/MEMORIALS/SOLEMNITIES THIS WEEK continued:

Many miracles were attributed to his intercession. This was especially the case in the 1950's when he was found incorrupt after fifty years. Interestingly, the decay of Sharbel's body coincided with the early days of the devastating civil war that broke out in Lebanon in 1975. In 1976, the Damour massacre took place. Palestinians attacked the Maronite Christian town. Many of Damour's residents were killed in battle, massacred, or forced to flee. The devotion, coupled with reports of numerous miracles, led to a new evangelization across Lebanon.

Feast of St. James, Apostle (7/25) First Century-c. 44 Patron Saint of blacksmiths, druggists, equestrians, hatmakers, laborers, pilgrims, knights, soldiers, tanners, veterinarians, and several countries and cities, including Santiago de Compostela, Spain. Invoked against arthritis and rheumatism. James the Greater, whom we honor today, was the brother of John, the Gospel writer. Their mother is traditionally believed to be Salome, who is identified as the sister to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Hence, if Salome and Mary were siblings, then James and John were Jesus' cousins. Though not much is known about the life of Saint James with certainty, we do know that he was privileged to witness Jesus' Transfiguration, His Agony in the Garden, and that Jesus prophesied that James would drink the cup that He drank, and be baptized with Jesus' baptism (see [Mark 10:39](#)). This "cup" and "baptism" are clear references to Saint James' martyrdom by which he would imitate his Lord. There is little doubt that his witnessing of Jesus being transfigured in glory and his presence with Jesus in the garden infused his natural temperament with grace, giving him courage to be the first of the Apostles to be martyred.

Memorial of Sts. Joachim & Anne, Parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary (7/26) Late First Century BC-AD Early First Century. Saint Anne - Patron Saint of grandparents, grandmothers, mothers, roommakers, cabinetmakers, carpenters, dressmakers, equestrians, expectant mothers, homemakers, housewives, lace workers, seamstresses, miners, old-clothes dealers, Canada, and France. Invoked against sterility and poverty and to find lost articles. Saint Joachim - Patron Saint of grandparents, grandfathers, fathers, married couples, cabinetmakers, and linen traders. Today, we honor the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the grandparents of Jesus.

PRAIRIE FIRE MINISTRIES

Prairie Fire Ministries began three decades ago when Tim Jameson crossed paths with Fr. Louis Greving in Des Moines, Iowa. Influenced by the exemplary life of Fr. Greving, Tim gained a deeper awareness of the divine calling placed upon his own life for service. Over the years, Tim dedicated himself to serving his community by fervently spreading the love of the Holy Spirit to everyone he encountered.

A turning point emerged for the ministry when Tim, with the help of Graeson Dall, began to provide consistent house calls, offering prayer to those in need. As word spread of Tim and Graeson's mission, it became evident that there was a profound hunger for the healing love of God in the community. Motivated by this realization and aspiring to minister on a broader scale, they began the monthly healing service at the Cathedral in Des Moines, Iowa.

With the gracious approval of their Bishop in 2021, Prairie Fire Ministries has ministered to people from across the country at the monthly healing service, offering them a transformative encounter with the living God. As we look to the future, the ministry aspires to continue to preach the message of the Gospel by expanding the monthly healing service to new places, as well as offering more intentional formation.
