SAINTS OF THE WEEK

Solemnity of The Annunciation of Our Lord (4/8) In the fifth century, bishops engaged in a fierce theological debate over the unity of the divine and human natures of Christ. St. Cyril, the Archbishop of Alexandria, argued that the divine and human natures of Jesus were united in one hypostasis. Divinity and humanity were perfectly united and, therefore, Mary is properly called the Theotokos, or "Mother of God," not just the "Mother of Christ." God was born of her, not just His body. Mary conceived a Person in her womb, and that Person was both God and man, perfectly united as one. In 431, the Church held a council at Ephesus and St. Cyril's position was adopted. Today's celebration of the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord recalls the historical event of the Angel Gabriel appearing to the Virgin Mary, as found in [Luke 1:26-38](#).

Saint Stanislaus, Bishop and Martyr, Memorial (4/11) 1030-1079, Patron Saint of Poland, soldiers in battle, moral order. Canonized by Pope Innocent IV on 9/17/1253, in Assisi, Italy. In 966, Mieszko I, duke and ruler of Poland, along with many others in his regal court, converted to the Catholic faith. Their conversion marked the beginning of what has been called "The Baptism of Poland." Many more conversions took place throughout the country, especially due to the efforts of missionary bishop Saint Adalbert. A little over a century later, a terrible blow was felt by the Catholics in Poland. The Archbishop of Krakow, Stanislaus of Szczepanów, was brutally martyred by King Bolesław II. In 1979, Pope Saint John Paul II, the former Archbishop of Krakow himself, referred to Saint Stanislaus' martyrdom as "Poland's Confirmation." Very little is known for certain about Saint Stanislaus, but his influence on Poland was great. He was ordained to the priesthood by the Bishop of Krakow and appointed canon at the cathedral. He became a well-respected preacher, was later appointed as a pastor, and eventually became the Vicar General of Krakow. When the Bishop of Krakow died, Stanislaus was chosen as his successor by popular acclaim. Initially, he refused the position, but on the explicit order of the pope, he accepted and was ordained a bishop around the age of forty-two. As a bishop, Stanislaus preached against immoralities at all social levels. He even confronted the king, Bolesław II. Eventually, after the king ignored the bishop's warnings, Bishop Stanislaus excommunicated the king. Outraged, Bolesław held a mock trial and found the bishop guilty of treason, punishable by death. When Bolesław's soldiers refused to carry out the order, Bolesław killed St. Stanislaus with his sword while he celebrated Mass. St. Stanislaus has been a guiding light to the Polish people and a source of hope when needed the most. His martyrdom confirmed Poland as a Christian country, strengthening its people throughout the years to become true witnesses to Christ no matter the cost.

Memorial of St. Martin I, Pope & Martyr (4/13) c. 595-655 Invoked by those persecuted by the state. Martin was born in a small town about 100 miles north of Rome. His family was noble, he was an excellent student, and very charitable to the poor. As a cleric, he assisted two popes in important roles (Pope John IV and Theodore I). He served as papal legate to Constantinople, where he worked closely with the emperor and patriarch, representing Pope Theodore in all matters. In 649, Pope Theodore died and named Martin as his successor. The custom that a newly elected pope receive approval of his appointment from the Byzantine emperor before his installation, did not occur. For the first time in more than 100 years, Martin immediately moved forward with his coronation without the express consent of Constans II. This angered Constans, but he did nothing about it, at first. Pope Martin immediately began dealing with the most pressing issues within the Church, angering the emperor, leading to his near death and exile for life to Crimea. The emperor ordered the Church in Rome to elect a new pope, even though Pope Martin was still alive. Pope Martin, seeking only the good of the Church, acquiesced. This abandonment by the Church leaders broke him and he died.



The RCIA journey through the sacraments continues with the final stage called Mystagogy, which means mystery. This is a time to reflect on the mystery of the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist) in light of the resurrection of Jesus the Christ. During this period Nichole Schreiner will enter her final preparation for Confirmation and Holy Eucharist, which we will celebrate Sunday, April 21 at the 10:00 a.m. Mass at Holy Family. Please continue your prayers for Chad and Nicole and the RCIA team. May these seven weeks of Easter be filled with many blessings for all of us and for our world.

John Lancaster Spalding Scholarship Fund Grants Now Available - Deadline is 4/26/24

Tuition assistance scholarship grants from the endowment fund established as a result of the Diocese of Peoria ROOTED IN FAITH Campaign and named in honor of Archbishop Spalding, the first Bishop of Peoria, will be available for the 2024-2025 school year for students enrolled in or intending to enroll in grades Kindergarten through 12 in any Catholic school located in the Diocese of Peoria whose families are active members of a Catholic parish in the diocese. All grants will be based on financial need objectively assessed. Information about the grants and application materials may be obtained from the Diocesan website www.cdop.org under the heading Catholic Education and then under Financial Assistance. Consult the detailed protocols and procedures and checklist for all requirements necessary to be eligible for an award. Parents must apply at: <https://online.factsmgt.com/aid>. Families of students currently receiving grants are reminded that all grants are for one year only, and anyone seeking to renew a grant for the 2024-2025 school year must reapply.

Deadline date for the completed application is April 26, 2024. Notification of grant awards will be made in June of 2024.

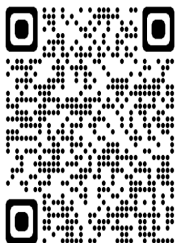
