Greetings and the Peace of Christ from Christians of the Catholic Diocese of Kitui, Kenya. Thank for having Fr. Nicodemus in your parishes. He is from our diocese and his priestly education was sponsored by a family in St. Marks Catholic Church, Peoria Diocese.

Kitui is a mission diocese covering 1900 sq. miles, with 35 parishes serving 1.2 Million people. The diocese is in Arid and Semi- Arid region of the Country, where one of the greatest challenges is drought and famine. For the last five (5) years the region has not received any meaningful rainfall. Poverty level stands at 65% with malnutrition at 52%. The main source of livelihood is subsistence farming: crops and livestock, but due to recurrent drought there is frequent cycle of famine making many people rely on the Government, Non- Governmental Organizations and the Church for relief aid. The trickle down effect of this influences everything including education, since schools close due to lack of clean water and the fees for tuition are redirected to buy food since the crops fail.

Your support during this mission appeal will bring hope to many people in Kitui. The funds will be used for the following:

1. School Fees for our Eighty-Nine (89) Seminarians
2. Youth and Pontifical Missionary Childhood Formation and Evangelization
3. Humanitarian Support to Vulnerable Children and Families
4. School Fees for Needy Students in the Diocese
5. Support to our Water, Health and Agriculture Projects
6. Support to St. John Eudes Rehabilitation Centre for Street Children

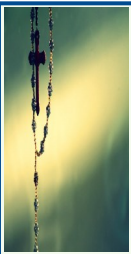
**FEASTS/MEMORIALS/SOLEMNITIES THIS WEEK**  
(Adapted from My Catholic Life)

**Memorial of Saint Aloysius Gonzaga, Religious (6/21)**  
- Patron Saint of students, Christian youth, Jesuit novices, AIDS patients and caregivers. Invoked against eye troubles and epidemics. Canonized by Pope Benedict XIII on December 31, 1726. Luigi Gonzaga was the firstborn son of eight children, the son of Ferrante Gonzaga, the Governor of Milan, Viceroy of Sicily, and a general in the Holy Roman Emperor's army. Luigi was expected to follow his father in a military career, but his devoutly Catholic mother had other hopes. Inspired by a letter from a Jesuit missionary, Aloysius privately vowed at age 11 to live a celibate life devoted to God and resolved to renounce his firstborn rights. He embraced every virtue, especially purity, and was so engrossed in catechetical studies and the lives of the saints that he began teaching catechism to other children.

At age twelve, Aloysius impressed then-cardinal and future saint, Charles Borromeo so much that Cardinal Borromeo personally prepared the boy for and administered his First Holy Communion, encouraging him to receive the Eucharist frequently. At 13, he said he wanted to become a Jesuit which angered his father. Over the next few years, his father and others tried to dissuade. Finally, Aloysius's father reluctantly consented. Aloysius passed his rank and inheritance to his brother and joined the Jesuit novitiate in Rome on 11/25/1585, at the age of eighteen.

Aloysius lived humbly in Rome, in prayer and often entering deep contemplation. He prayed before the Blessed Sacrament, grew in devotion to Our Lady, and meditated on Christ's Passion. With the future saint Robert Bellarmine as his spiritual director and teacher, Aloysius was obedient, chaste, and charitable, especially towards the poor.

When the bubonic plague ravaged Rome in 1591, Aloysius dedicated himself to caring for the sick, fulfilling his duties with great joy. Eventually, he contracted the disease and embraced his suffering with much rejoicing and prophesied the day of his death, which was revealed to him in a vision. It occurred on the Octave day of the Solemnity of Corpus Christi when he was just twenty-three years old.

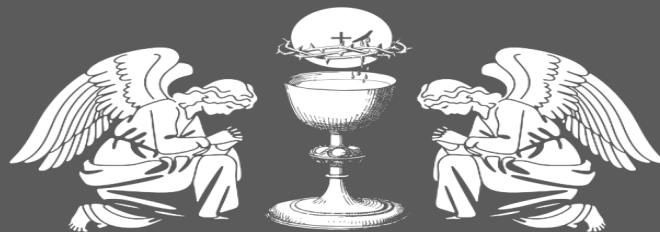
